## Courses – SIPL 2010 July 5 - 16, 2010

### INTRODUCTION TO LITURGY

9:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. **Murray Kroetsch**

This course lays out the foundations for understanding the nature of the Church's liturgy. It introduces participants to the building blocks of the liturgy: paschal mystery, ritual, symbol, and song, sacramentality, the assembly and ministries, liturgical time and space, the Word of God, corporate prayer, and the liturgical books and documents of the post-conciliar Church.

### THE LITURGICAL ACT: LITURGICAL SPIRITUALITY FOR ALL TIMES AND PLACES

9:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. **Bill Burke**

This course unpacks the riches of article 14 of the *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*. It studies the participation to which the Council calls us, a participation "demanded by the very nature of liturgy" (§14, SC). The course studies this "very nature" of liturgy and the profound implications it has for living the Christian way of life.

### SING TO THE LORD! MUSIC FOR LITURGY AND THE REVISED GENERAL INSTRUCTION OF THE ROMAN MISSAL

10:45 a.m. – 12:15 p.m. **Heather Reid**

This course considers the basic principles for choosing music for liturgical celebrations with special attention given to the changes regarding music found in the revised GIRM. How does our choice of music enable the assembly to pray and praise God?

### DOES IT MATTER WHERE WE PRAY?

10:45 a.m. – 12:15 p.m. **Phil Horrigan**

It can be said that ritual action shapes ritual space and that this relationship is critical to the liturgical praxis and formation of a sacramental people. This course explores the theology of liturgical space and the implications for the design, decoration and arrangement of our communal places of worship.

### THE RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

1:30 p.m. – 3:00 p.m. **Catherine Ecker**

The course is an introduction to the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults. Using the rite, principles of Christian initiation are explored, including, the primacy of the spiritual journey and the role of all the baptized in the initiation process. The relationship between liturgy, catechesis, Christian life and ministry are explored.

### THE ART OF PRESIDING

1:30 p.m. – 3:00 p.m. **John Hibbard**

This course focuses on the ministry of leading the liturgical prayer of the assembly. It familiarizes participants with aspects of presiding, examining the purpose, principles and structure of liturgical celebrations and the role of ritual, symbolism and music. It focuses on the needed qualities for those who preside, giving participants the opportunity to lead a liturgy of the word or hours.

### SYNTHESIS COURSE FOR GRADUATES

7:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. **Patty Fowler and Myrtle Power**

(Monday through Thursday of each week)  
This course provides a practical integration experience for participants completing the certificate. "Unless adult Christians engage in critical and conscious theological reflection, the Christian community's faithfulness to the gospel and its authentic witness to that gospel in the world diminishes" Patricia O'Connell Killen, *The Art of Theological Reflection*.

# The Summer Institute in Pastoral Liturgy

Responding to Vatican II and the Church's call for ongoing liturgical renewal, the Faculty of Theology at Saint Paul University, in close cooperation with the National Office for Liturgy of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops, established the Summer Institute in Pastoral Liturgy.

## THE AIM

The aim of SIPL is to enable those who prepare, lead and evaluate the liturgical activity of the Church (parish liturgy committee members, ministers, musicians, catechists, clergy, religious and seminarians) to become more familiar with the various liturgical rites of the Church and to develop skills useful for liturgical ministry. SIPL is staffed mainly by Canadians who hold graduate degrees in pastoral liturgy or related fields.

The session normally runs for two weeks, Monday through Friday, with a usual course load of three courses per summer. Each course is one and a half hours per day. Students can earn a Pastoral Certificate in Liturgy which consists of six core courses, three electives and the practicum modules. A full-time participant would therefore be eligible for the Certificate after three summers.



## THO 2160 Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (3 cr.)

Students can earn three credits from the Faculty of Theology by taking three approved SIPL courses and writing one additional research paper due August 26, 2010.
